Subject :- Scheme for setting up of five new colleges at Jadavpur,  
Barisha, Vaishnab Ghat, Bon-Hooghly and Dum Dum to relieve  
congestion in the existing colleges at Calcutta.

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Sir,

I am directed to refer to the correspondence resting with the State Government letter No. 11471-Misc., dated the 20th September, 1955 on the above subject and to convey the sanction of the President to the grant of a sum not exceeding Rs.33,24,000/- (Rupees thirty-three lakhs and twenty-four thousand only) as loan to the State Government on account of the non-recurring expenditure as per details given in Annexure A, for setting up of five new colleges for the education of displaced students from East Pakistan at Jadavpur, Barisha, Vaishnab Ghat, Bon-Hooghly and Dum Dum with a view to relieving the congestion in the existing colleges of Calcutta. The sanction for this loan is subject to the conditions mentioned below :-

- (a) One-third of the amount of loan will be advanced in the current year and the remainder in the year 1956-57.
- (b) The loan will be repayable in annual equated instalments of principal and interest at 4½% (four and a half per cent), per annum in a period of 20 years. The first instalment of the repayment will fall due on the 4th Anniversary date of the drawal of the loan by the State Government and for the first 3 years only simple interest will be charged.
- (c) The Professors and Lecturers of the College should be appointed after selection by the West Bengal Public Service Commission and preference given to displaced persons from East Pakistan other things being equal.
- (d) The majority of the students admitted to the college should be displaced persons.
- (e) The loan sanctioned for one of the colleges shall not be diverted to another College nor utilised for other Schemes.

2. I am also to convey the sanction of the President to the payment to the State Government of a grant representing the entire recurring costs of the five new colleges less the amounts received as the fees and other receipts during the first & second years of the setting up of the colleges upto a ceiling of Rs. 66,000/- for each college for the first academic year and Rs. 1 lakh for the second academic year.

3. I am further to convey the sanction of the President to the following grants being made to the State Government at the ceiling rates given below, towards the recurring cost of the five colleges, less the amounts received as fees and other receipts, from the third to the fifth academic year of each college.

Bon-Hooghly ... Brahma Keshab Chandra College (after the name of Brahma Keshab Chandra Sen).

Subject : Scheme for setting up of new Colleges to relieve congestion  
in the existing Colleges in Calcutta.

The undersigned is directed to say that in pursuance of the decision as conveyed by the Government of India in their letter No. RH-5(5)/55-Genl. dated the 7th January, 1956 (copy enclosed), Government have been pleased to sanction establishment of 5 new Colleges on a sponsored basis for the education mainly of displaced students from East Pakistan at Jadavpur, Baishnabghat, Narkeldanga, Dum Dum and Bon-Hooghly with the staff and expenditure as detailed in the enclosed statement.

Each College will have affiliation in the Intermediate and Degree Courses both in Arts & Science in the following subjects :-

- I.A. - English, Bengali (Vernacular), Additional Paper in Alternative Bengali, Alternative Bengali, Logic, Civics, History, Sanskrit, Mathematics, Commercial Geography, Commercial Arithmetic and Elements of Book Keeping.
- I.Sc. - English, Bengali (Vernacular), Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Botany, Biology.
- B.A. - In following Pass subjects only :  
English, Bengali (Vernacular), Additional Paper in Alternative Bengali, Economics, Philosophy, History, Sanskrit, Bengali (Vernacular).
- B.Sc. - In following Pass subjects only :  
~~English, Bengali (Vernacular),~~ Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Botany.

The total strength in each of the Colleges will be approximately 750 with an ultimate capacity for 1,000 students.

In the first year of the Scheme the teaching posts as sanctioned may be filled up as and when necessary in addition to the post of Principal.

The post of Vice-Principal will be filled up with the approval of Government.

Tuition fees will be charged at the following rates :-

I.A.	-	Rs. 8/-	per month
I.Sc.	-	Rs. 10/-	per month.
B.A.	-	Rs. 10/-	per month.
B.Sc.	-	Rs. 12/-	per month.
Development fee	-	Re. 1/-	per month.

5% of the students will be allowed free tuition and 10% of the students will be allowed half-free tuition.

Pending construction of the College buildings, there is no objection to starting the First and Third year classes of the Colleges in the current Session by arranging alternative accommodation in the High School buildings in the neighbourhood. The alternative accommodation which has been provisionally arranged in the following High School buildings is approved :-



1. Baishnabghata - Garia Barada Prosad High School.
2. Narikeldanga - Shyamaprosad Institution.
3. Dum Dum - Christ Church Girls' High School.
4. Bon-Hooghly - Sagar Dutta H.E. School.
5. Jadavpur - In the compound of the Jadavpur College of Engineering and Technology.

Suitable rent which may have to be paid to the school authorities on account of the provisional accommodation will require approval of Government. The charge in that respect may be met from the recurring charges provided for these Colleges under contingencies.

The Governing Body will be constituted according to the rules framed for sponsored Colleges.

The College will be run in accordance with rules as prescribed for sponsored Colleges.

Sanction of Government is now accorded to the payment of an advance grant not exceeding Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees ten thousand) only, towards the recurring expenditure for each College for the first academic year to the Principal or the Vice-Principal as the case may be, pending approval of the Governing Body by Government. The Director of Public Instruction will draw and disburse the grant according to needs of each College.

Every year the Director of Public Instruction will obtain from the Colleges and furnish the Government with a statement of account for each of the Colleges showing the expenditure and receipts during the academic year and also a statement showing the number of displaced students receiving education in each of these Colleges for transmission to the Ministry of Rehabilitation, Government of India.

The charge will be debited to the head "57-Miscellaneous - Expenditure on displaced persons - D.-Rehabilitation-Grants-in-aid, Grants to Sponsored Colleges" in the budget for 1956-57.

The Accountant General, West Bengal and the Pay and Accounts Officer (Education), West Bengal, have been informed.

Orders in respect of non-recurring grants will follow shortly. Orders in regard to Barisha College will issue separately.

4. The sanction of the grants in paragraphs 2 and 3 above is subject to the following conditions :-

- (a) That every year the Government of West Bengal shall submit a statement of account for each of the colleges to the Ministry of Rehabilitation showing the expenditure and receipts during the academic year.
- (b) That the State Government shall submit each year a statement showing the number of displaced students receiving education in each of these colleges, and
- (c) That from the sixth academic year onwards, the Government of India shall have no liability in respect of these colleges.

5. The portion of expenditure to be treated as 'Grant' will be debitable to the head "57-Miscellaneous Expenditure on displaced persons B. Rehabilitation E. 3-Grants-in-aid E.3(1) Grants to States E.3(1)(1) Grants to Part 'A' States (Government of West Bengal)" and will be met out of the budget allotments made or to be made to the State Government from time to time. The portion of expenditure to be incurred by the State Government as loan will be met out of the loan advanced to be advanced by the Central Government by debit to "A-Loans and Advances by the Central Government A.1(1) Advances to Part 'A' and 'B' States" in the Central Book.
